It helps them to understand their mind and aptitude. Group-B Social and political philosophy Unit I The course helps the students to have a vivid knowledge on the formation and growth of society, community, association, state and nation. The theories depicting the relation between the individual and the state are given a clear assessment in this course. Unit-II The course gives the student knowledge of political ideas like democracy, socialism, feminism. The political views of MK Gandhi, Marx, Sartre, MN Roy and Rabindranath Tagore are also emphasized in this course for the total development of the student. Group-A Western Logic Paper- IV Unit-1 The traditional logic including conversion, obversion, opposition of proposition, categorical syllogism and Boolean interpretation along with Venn Diagram are taught in this course. Unit-II The logical theories including Analogy, Mill's methods, scientific and unscientific explanations and probability are taught to the students in this course to give them a critical mental ability. Group-B Unit-1 The Symbolic Logic, and the rules of Inference and Replacement are taught here in details.

Paper	VI Ethics	Group-A Unit- I The most important part of philosophy is taught in this course. The students here learn what ethics is, what morality is and what are the objects of moral judgement. The other important themes like Hedonism, Utilitarianism are taught in this course to make our mind more analytic towards attainment of pleasure and pain.
		Unit- II Along with Kant's Deontological Moral Theory, the Indian concepts of Purusarthas, Karma are taught to give the students a profound knowledge of the rich cultural heritage of Indian Philosophy.
		Group-B Unit- I Ethics should not be a theoretical subject only, but should have practical applications. This is taught in this course with special reference to Peter Singer and contemporary medical topics like killing, suicide, euthanasia are also taught here.
		Unit- II Today's world needs a proper study of environmental ethics, which is taught in this course. Along with ecology, and reverence for life Gandhi, Vivekananda and Vedanta's practical ethics are taught in this course.

Philosophical Universal religion and the different proofs for the existence of God both in classics/ essay Indian and Western Philosophy are taught in this part. writing Unit-II The theories taught in Western Philosophy against the existence of God like Materialism, Naturalism, Positivism, Agnosticism are dealt with in this course. Famous Indian philosophical schools like Buddhism. Samkhya and Mimamsha and their proofs against God's existence are taught in this paper. Religious language and the concepts of Hinduism, Christianity and Islam are taught to free our minds from any sort of dogmatism. Group-B Philosophical Classics Unit-I Vedantasara by Sadanandayogindra is taught in this Course starting from Mangalacharan to ajnana nirupama to teach in details the most important Indian Philosophical School. Unit-II From Iswara Nirupana to atma nirupana of Vedantasara are taught in this course to give the students the idea of traditional knowledge system and its relevance in contemporary world.
