Part I


Paper-I History of India, Pre- Historic Times to the End of 15th Century.

After completion of the course students will be able

- To analyse the factors responsible for the origin and decline of Harapan civilization.
- To understand various aspects of material culture, society, economy, polity and religious practices of early and later Vedic age.
- To understand the process of development of various types of state system like monarchy, republican and centralized state as well as the rise of Mahajanapadas and the formation of large empire.
- To discuss the ways in which historians have questioned the nature of Mauryan state, Ashokan 'dhamma' and the causes behind the fall of the empire.
- To get knowledge about the debate regarding Gupta period as 'golden' age and rise of feudalism.
- To observe the changes in the field of agriculture, technology, trade, urbanization and society and the major points of changes during the entire period.

Paper-II History of India, 1526-1914

- To Discuss the foundation and consolidation of power under the great Mughal emperor Akbar.
- To learn Political conquests over Gujarat, Rajputana, North west frontier, Bengal and Deccan under the rule of Akbar which made the Mughal a pan Indian empire
- Expansion of Mughal empire and the incorporation of Rajputs and other indigenous groups in the Mughal nobility.
- To get the knowledge about the religious and cultural scenarios during the reign of Mughal in India, especially the impact of Bhakti and Sufi movement.
- To get idea about religious tolerance showed by the Mughal rulers and specially
 evolution of Akbar's religious policy and philosophical foundations of Sul-e-kul
 promoted by Akbar.

- To analyse the different phases of Congress politics from the moderate to the rise of extremist inside Congress which led to the road of mass involvement in the politics through Swadeshi movement.

Paper-III History of Europe, 1789-1945

After completion of the course students will be able

- To gain knowledge of the historiography of the French Revolution.
- To learn how several political, economical and social crisis and philosophical foundation of French revolution which ultimately gave birth to the modern political thoughts.
- To learn about the rise of Napoleon and his empire.
- To comprehend about the impact of the revolution outside of France.
- To learn about the fall of Napoleon and restoration of old regime under the leadership of Metternich.
- To learn how the concept of nationalism emerges in world politics.
- To learn about the transformation in society and economy in nineteenth-century Europe.
- To comprehend features of revolutionary actions in different parts of Europe in late nineteenth and early twentieth century.
- To learn about the rise of Balkan nationalism and its far reaching impact on political scenario of Europe.
- To comprehend the nature of Tsarist autocracy in Russia, reforms under Tsar

- To learn how League of Nations fail to fulfil its ideals and the background of Second World war and its outcome.
