- To give an idea to the students about the lives and legacies women Revolutionaries of Bengal who had been given little significance in the conventional syllabus just mentioning few names of them. For the present generation Pritilata, Kalpana Dutta, Bina Das have little significance or none at all beyond text book engagement or of compulsive celebration.

Outcome of the activity:

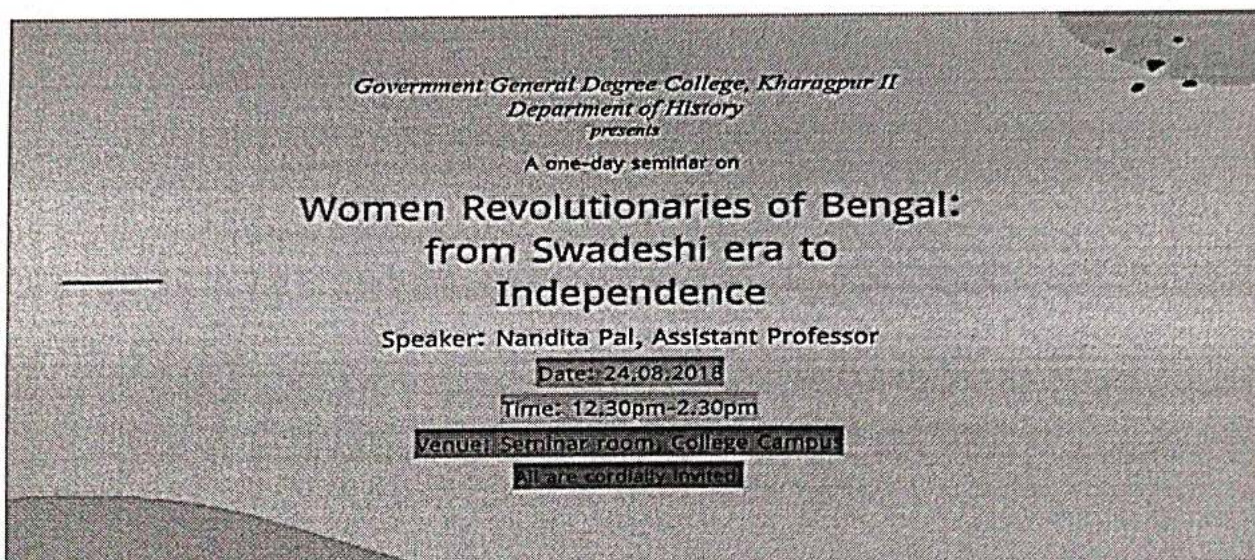
Honourable OIC sir, Dr Partha Sarathi Sinha inaugurated the seminar by lighting up the traditional lamp. In the welcome address OIC sir spoke on the basic purpose of holding the seminar and urged the students to participate with enthusiasm in this platform meant for creative and academic discussion and intellectual interaction. In this lecture, the speaker drew attention to the fact that majority of the works published specifically on militant or revolutionary movement of India remained largely androcentric. Revolution, Violence,

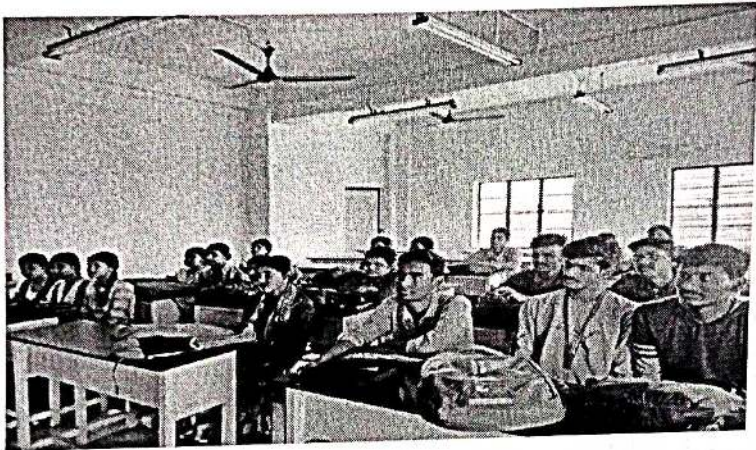
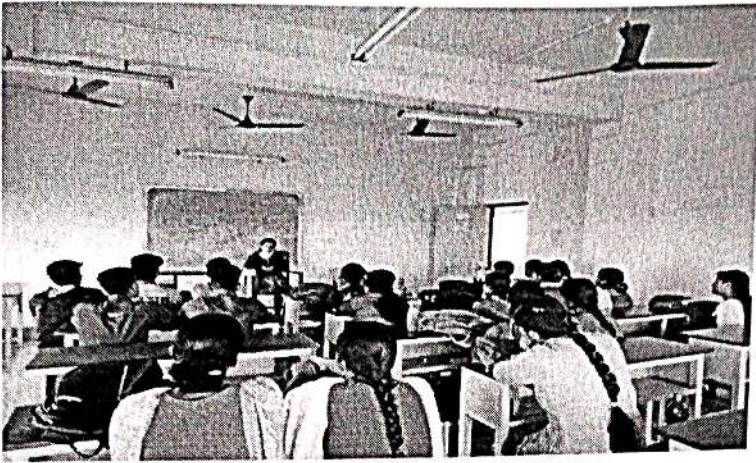
terrorism are culturally associated with men, thus culturally defined as not feminine. She argued by involving in the revolution women revolutionaries transgressed in the so called masculine domain. She also focused on sociocultural background of these women, their perception of revolution, colonial exploitation, nationalism and stereotypical concepts gendered role, social expectations that denied the participation of women in terrorist activities. She explained though women started to participate in revolutionary movement from Swadeshi era but their role were passive, mainly limited to giving ornaments for raising fund, exchanging letters, message secretly, giving shelters to male revolutionaries. But 1930 marked the turning point in the participation of women in India's struggle for freedom. This year women for the first time became equal partners, activists and comrades in the armed struggle as the women revolutionary took part in assassination and other kind violent action, remained underground and accepted martyrdom and imprisonment.


This session was followed by a question answer session in which students participated actively.

In the Valedictory Session, the Convener of the Seminar, Asst. Professor and Head Sujit Das gave vote of thanks finally. Certificates of participation for the seminar were distributed to the students. All the sessions were truly enriching and intellectually engaging.

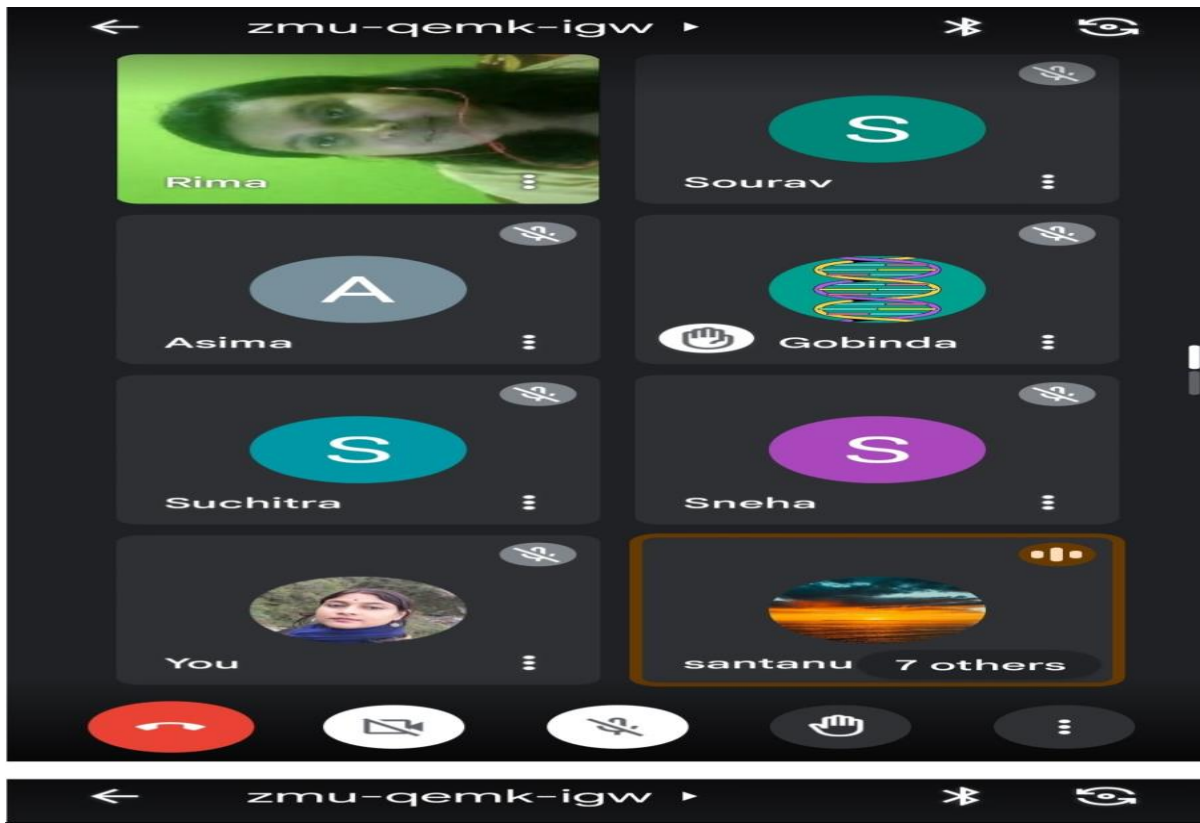

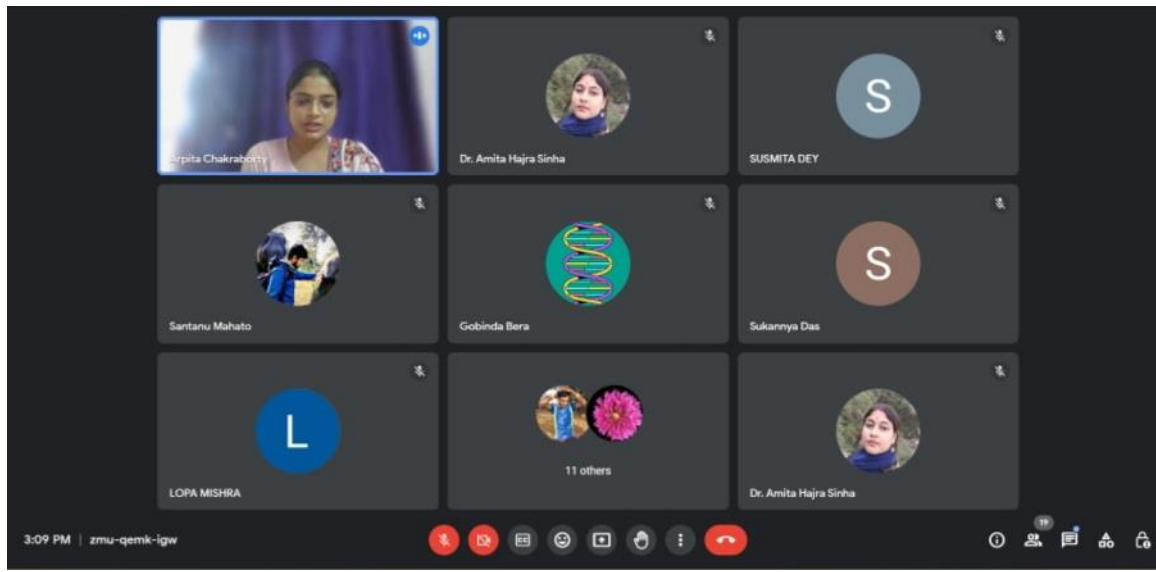

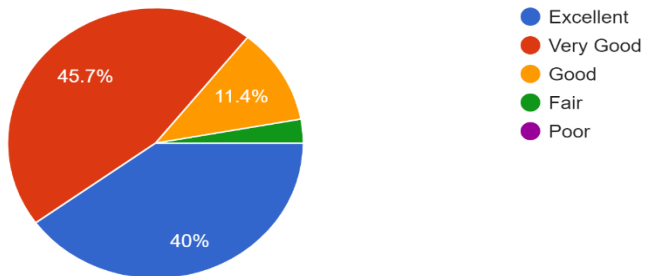

One Day Students' seminar Report

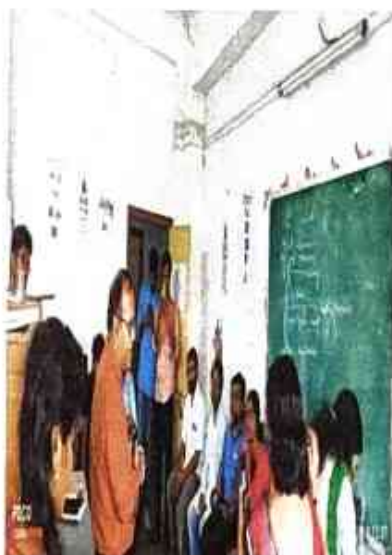
Title: One Day Students' seminar on Infectious Diseases.

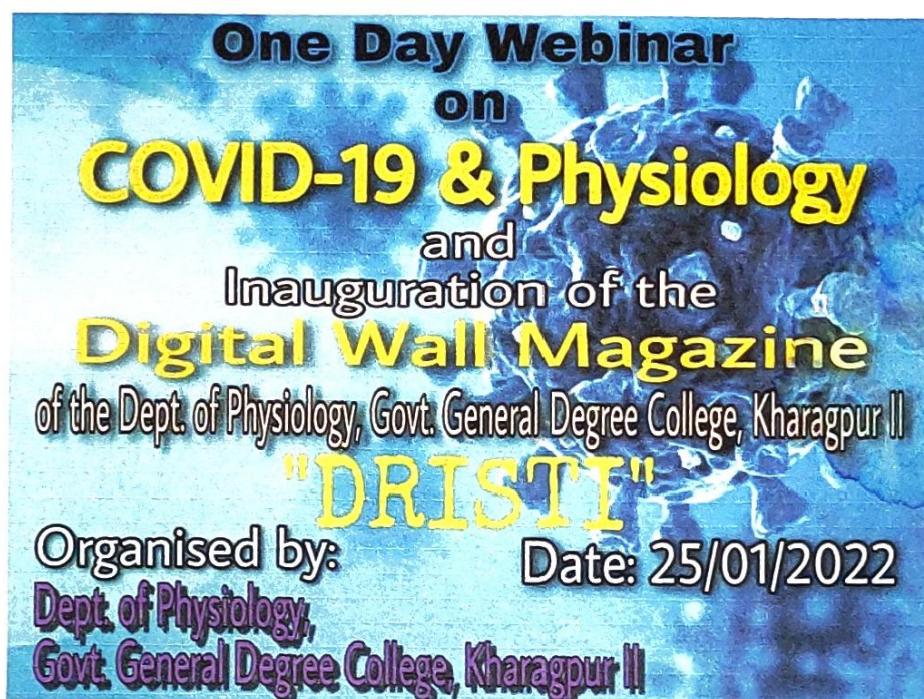

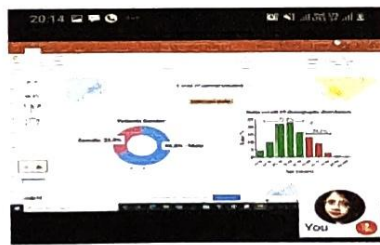
Participants: The students, faculties, staff of GGDC at KGP-II, students and faculties from other colleges and academic institutions. There were 100 participants in the event.

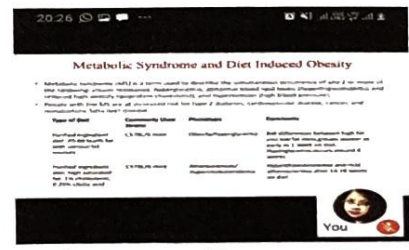




